

### Committee Structure after the March AGM

# Ashford, Wye & District U3A

Visit to: The Brand Museum on Tuesday 23rd April 2019

Supermarket archaeologist Robert Opie has spent 50 years collecting historical brands and packaging to form the Museum of Brands. The 10,000 items on display in the Branding Hall and Time Tunnel relate the interesting stories behind many of our favourite products. This is a real trip down memory lane and should trigger some nostalgic hot spots on the way. Test your memory skills matching the advertising jingle to the brand. We hope you will enjoy this journey, which allows an overall view of the social changes in the last 50 years.

On arrival we have allowed time for refreshments before the tours begin. To allow time and space, our tours will be self-guided, half of the group touring the Brand Hall while the others view the Time Tunnel. The groups will then change venue to complete the tours. We have allowed 2 hours in total for the tours.

Members will then be free to walk down to Portobello Market (approx 10/15 mins). There are plenty of pubs and cafes etc. on the way to and inside the market for a bite to eat.

The museum has a very attractive garden cafe offering snacks and light lunches. However, NB the museum is unable to accommodate 38 members for lunch. Anyone wishing to remain for lunch must advise us in order to book a place.

# Ashford, Wye & District U3A

Visit to: Wrest Park House Garden and Lakes on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> June 2019

Wrest Park has 90 acres of gardens, woodlands and lakes. Much of the development of the gardens bears the imprint of Capability Brown. Features of the park include an archaeological collection spanning 2,000 years; the recently restored Archer Pavilion, Chinese Temple and Bath house the orangery and colonnaded Bowling Green House and the garden sculpture in the ornamental dairy.

The house itself boasts Countess Henrietta's sitting room furnished as it was in the 1840's. Discover how the house served as the country's original First World War Convalescent Home through the photographs and diaries of those who served and convalesced there.

The cafe in the walled garden provides light lunches and refreshments. You may prefer to bring a picnic to enjoy in the beautiful surroundings.
