Walks with Phil

All members able to walk for up to two hours are very welcome to join us on any of these walks. Just turn up with sturdy footwear. Any concerns please ring or text me.

Friday 29 December 2023 - A reminder that we will be meeting at Ashingdon and East Hawkwell hall by 9.45 to car share to Marsh Farm in South Woodham Ferres for a three miles level walk eastward along the Crouch estuary.

Friday 5 January 2024 - Let's meet ready to walk by 9.45 at Hockley Woods car park. Fees are 50p for 2 hours or 70p for 3 hours. We will walk down and up gentle slopes through the woods, down to New England Woods and across to Gusted Hall Lane and then back up to Hockley woods returning on a different path back to our cars. Perhaps just over 4 miles of gentle ups and downs through woods and low intensity farm and park land.

Friday 19 January 2024 - Let's meet at Paglesham Churchend as near to the church as possible ready to walk by 9.45. We will walk east along footpaths along field boundaries and then a very quiet dead end road towards Paglesham Eastend. This time we will circle anticlockwise with the sea wall on our right before rejoining the same quiet road and footpath to return to our cars. A very level walk of about 4 miles with pleasant and varied terrain.

Friday 2 February 2024 - Let's meet at Magnolia Park car park (free) ready to walk by 9.45. We will walk clockwise towards Greensward Clinic and then across the main road and follow paths leading up to Beckney Woods. We will swing eastwards and back to the main road before following paths along to Rouncefall Farm and back down to Magnolia Park. Perhaps just over 4 miles of varied terrain with some ups and downs and some decent views over the Crouch valley.


