Our speaker in October was Rick Stewart. "The road to Messines, Military mining on the Western Front 1915 – 1918". This was a fascinating account of their tunnelling by Allied and German troops beneath each others lines and planting explosives. Rick held our attention with a terrific account of the design and use of tunnelling, then placing of explosives under each others lines, then answering lots of audience questions. A first class presentation.

In November we have Dr. Lee Bray, Archeologist of Dartmoor National Park who will talk about its history. Lee qualified first as a geologist, then as an archeologist, followed by a Doctorate. In between he worked in the oil industry. We are fortunate to have him talk to us regarding Dartmoor.
