Just a gentle reminder to everybody that the renewal of membership will become due on the 1st of March 2023. There is a new system being used now and we ask that, if possible, you would please pay by Bank Transfer giving your membership number as a reference. The fee is £15.

Do not put anything else in the reference box other than your number, as the box is very small, so just up to 4 digits please.

If you are paying this way, and if the information we hold is correct, there is no need to send a form.

## **GROUPS' REPORT**

One of the things that I have enjoyed the most about being a member of the Basildon & Billericay u3a are the outings. I really love exploring new places, or familiar places with new people to find out new information together. At one time we had a group called The Discovery Group, and with that group I visited places like the Sainsbury distribution centre at the other side of the Dartford Crossing and the Mini plant in Cowley, Oxford. These were places that I would never have visited on my own. The Mini plant was absolutely amazing, watching the different robots working away as if directed by some unseen conductor.

The other groups I belong to also instigate outings. With the Art Appreciation Group we visit different galleries and exhibitions, the Essex History Group has helped me discover places in a county that I have lived in for a long time and, even the Wine Appreciation Group has taken me to investigate some of our local vineyards.

I think that we are very lucky in our u3a to find people with similar interests who enjoy discovering places together. If your group lends itself to making visits, please do try to organise outings. It doesn't have to be too far away, we have some interesting places on our doorsteps. All you have to do is make sure that you complete a risk assessment for the visit, then catch a bus or take a train somewhere. If you have to drive, make sure that those members without access to a vehicle are allowed to share a car journey. You can share the costs of the fuel; we have a suggested amount to share between you, per mile.

It was an outing yesterday that gave me the idea for this article. For Christmas I was given a guided tour of the Royal Opera House in Covent Garden. I went with my eldest daughter yesterday and we had an amazing experience. We saw both opera singers and principle ballet dancers rehearsing. We saw the costume store and where the costumes are made, or repaired. We saw the massive backstage area and learned about how they move the gigantic sets around. They have the second largest lift in the country; it will take a large lorry full of sets from the road up to the backstage area! I can really recommend a visit; they do lots of different tours which are not expensive. You don't have to travel to London for a tour; you can also visit their props and scenery store in Rainham. Perhaps get Father Christmas to give you a ticket next Christmas!

Oh, and they also have a very nice restaurant and bar area on the fifth floor that anyone can visit for a drink or something to eat!

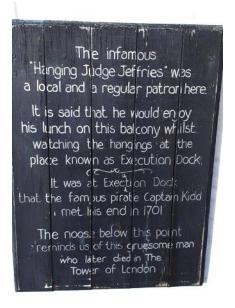

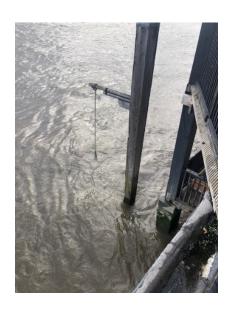
## RAMBLING GROUP

Some of this involved walking along Wapping High Street, which is much changed from when I used to be a frequent visitor to the infamous "Prospect of Whitby". These photos show a sign in the pub and a mock-up of the Execution rope, where the high tide had to cover the guilty party three times before they were cut down.
