In January, Paul Whittle spoke about "The Venetian Connection", visiting relevant locations in the Mediterranean before venturing into the Adriatic Sea, to Split, Dubrovnik and then Venice, where the main sites and islands, with historical backgrounds, were viewed. The talk was expertly delivered and well received.

Our speaker this month is Linda Regan who will entertain us with a presentation entitled **Acting Can Be Murder**.

Linda is an actress who most people will have seen on TV or film. She has also had several crime novels published. She appeared in the first five series of "Hi De Hi", "Minder", "Bergerac", "Holby City", "The Bill" and others as well. She played a lead character's girlfriend in "Quadrophenia", has recorded audio books, featured on Radio 4 and provided the voice overs for around 100 advertisements. Her books have been successful, one receiving an accolade from Colin Dexter of "Morse" fame.

Her talk is described as 'amusing' to 'laugh out loud funny' with anecdotes and stories about her career.

Ideally, we would like two volunteers for this role so that they can shadow Jenny with a view to one of them perhaps taking over as Chair and the other continuing as Vice Chair from November 2023.

As mentioned above, if no-one comes forward to be Chair, the Bearsted & District u3a will have to close and will cease to exist. Any remaining funds will be transferred to u3a HQ. It may be possible to merge with another u3a, such as Maidstone or maybe further afield. We are sure that members do not want our u3a to close. It has been very successful and it would be a shame to see the efforts of so many over the years come to naught.

Please come forward if you feel you have the time and skills necessary to take on the roles of Chair and Vice-Chair. Please be aware that you will not be expected to do everything. You will get all the help you need. The committee is there to help and share any tasks which arise.


Contributions from Members
