From Richard: Our speaker for this month's meeting on 12th January will be Major Paul Whittle TD and his talk is entitled The Venetian Connection. Paul is a Freeman of the City of London having worked in HR at one of the Banks, served 34 years in the Territorial Army, being awarded the Territorial Decoration, and was involved in NATO exercises. He is a lecturer on Fred Olsen and P&O cruise ships having been public speaking for over 20 years. He supports more charities than I care to mention. His talks cover a wide range from `Eritrea` to `Hill Stations of the Raj` etc. etc.

This talk deals with who started building Venice, and why, right through to the recently built lagoon flood prevention system. He covers the rise of Venetian Maritime power with references to Dubrovnik, Split and other cities, visits the lesser known islands (e.g. Murano, where the famous glassware is made), as well as some of the popular tourist traps. I believe the Orient Express fits in somewhere!
