I've just read that Bromley u3a are starting a Daytime Disco which sounds a great idea. Would someone like to start a **Bearsted Boogie** group?



Stunning private garden featured on BBC Gardeners' World in 2022. Designed to provide year-round habitat for all wildlife, especially pollinating insects. See which moths visit after dark and pick up tips as to how to make your own garden nature friendly.
