8. Who spent the shortest period of time as a reigning monarch?

9. Who was the oldest successor to be declared monarch?

10. King Aldfrith of Northumbria is known for having written several books amongst which was a very light hearted one. What was its subject?

1. Where in the Kingdom of Spain is its highest point? On Tenerife. It is Teide-Pico Viejo volcano at 3718 m (7500m above the sea floor) and the world's third tallest volcano.

2. Who wrote "The Ingenious Hidalgo Don Quixote de la Mancha", published in 1604-5? Miguel de Cervantes Saavedra.

3. Sir Francis Drake is said to have singed the king of Spain's beard. Where did this event occur? Cadiz in1587.

4. Which ruler of Portugal died believing that he was still in charge, though he had been deposed 2 years before? The dictator, Antonio de Salazar in 1970 (he had a stroke in 1968).

5. In which year were the Moors finally expelled from Iberia? 1492.

6. Portugal is said to be the UK's oldest ally. This alliance was forged via the marriage of John 1 of Portugal to the granddaughter of which English king? Edward III. Phillipa was the daughter of John of Gaunt.

7. By which treaty did Pope Alexander VI bring about the division of the New World between Spain and Portugal in 1494? Tordesillas.

8. Where in the Republic of Portugal is its highest point? Mount Pico on Pico Island in the Azores. It is 2351 m above sea level.

9. Who was the first king of Portugal, acceding to the throne in 1139? Alphonso I, nicknamed "the Conqueror" (of the Moors).

10. The Portuguese Douro World Heritage Site is famous for which product? **Port.**
