# Speaker Secretary (Richard)

At the August meeting we welcomed Philip Oostenbrink, the head gardener at Walmer Castle. Philip gave us an account of his career so far, following this with a short history of Walmer Castle and its gardens; and explained recent work there under his direction. The net result was that many attendees expressed a wish to visit Walmer.

At our **September** meeting Andrew Baker, a retired headmaster and cruise ship lecturer, will present "British Politics in Turmoil", looking at the interlocking factors that lie behind the upheaval brought about by, for example, multiple PM's, Brexit, the financial crash and the pandemic; and how all this shapes our thinking today.

Looking forward to October, we will be joined by Jack Deans, who was employed in a civilian capacity by the Metropolitan Police, working as a forensic investigator. 
### World Faiths Group (Claire)
