

Guidelines for Playing Petanque at Beccles Quay

Following the latest UK government guidelines* for self isolation by those with symptoms, and those living with them as well as those who are instructed to do so by NHS contact tracers, or living within a 'local lockdown area,' who must stay at home, others may play Boules subject to the following guidelines:

Each player should consider their own personal health and circumstances and only play if they consider the activity low risk to themselves and those in their household.

The total number of players on the playing area at any one time should not exceed 6.
The number of spectators in the general area should not exceed 30.

Players must use their own Boules and Cochonet (and no other equipment), these should not be shared between households and thoroughly cleaned or quarantined for 72 hours after use.

Players (and spectators) from different households must keep 2m apart (or 1m for short periods, side by side) and be respectful of other users of the quay (from whom they should also keep 2m apart),

Players should wash their hands thoroughly with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, as soon as possible before leaving home and before play if possible.

If equipment comes into contact with people or equipment from another household, alcohol gel and hand sanitisers should be used as an interim measure, before more thorough cleaning can take place

Players should wash their hands thoroughly with soap and water, as soon as possible after play and on their return home.

These Guidelines will be subject to change, and updated in the light of any new government advice.
