AGM and Updates

As stated elsewhere the Annual General Meeting is at 2pm Tuesday 27 September.

Update on SIM Membership

Just to confirm that the reason for a Full and SIM membership (Special Interest Member) is that for our Richmond Hall meetings we have a safety limit of 120 attendees. With a total membership of around 300 it could present problems.

Having a SIM Membership with limited access to the Richmond Hall meetings allows us to manage attendance and to avoid any notion of a waiting list to join our u3a.

Looking at meeting attendance since the Covid lockdowns, the Committee has decided that it is possible to increase the number of meetings that SIMs can attend annually from 2 to 3 plus the AGM. This is effective now.


