

### Your landline telephones are changing!

You may already be aware that all of our home phones will be changing to digital technology over the next 2 years or so.

This means that our calls will not be the so-called analogue signal (like sound waves) but will be coded into digital segments for transmission. This will give forter, more consistent sound quality and will potentially make international calls cheaper. So what's involved?



For those of us that have relatively modern phones, they will connect directly into your existing internet router and work as usual. For the members who do not have or want the internet, the phone companies are required to offer you a 'simple internet connection', dedicated to landline phone operation and nothing else. The cost should be no more than the current line rental.

Those with very old handsets may need to replace them and any directly wired extensions will not work. Some people now exclusively use mobile phones for conversations and if you don't want internet this may well be the best solution.

The digital phone system will fail if there is a power cut (the old analogue lines would have continued working) unless you have a battery backup (most people won't). Again, many people use a mobile phone as the back-up.

This change may disproportionately affect older people and so AGE UK have produced an excellent webpage to clarify issues.

There are also two other issues. The telephone companies 'may' try and find reasons to charge you extra – resist, they have a responsibility to come up with solutions. And, as always, SCAMS, please be wary of unsolicited phone calls and letters relating to these changes. Always go back to your existing telephone service provider using your regular contact routes as displayed on bills.
