
Scrabble Group

Local History Group 1

The **Local History Group 1** visited Beverley Westwood for their July meeting and explored its Bronze Age and Iron Age burial mounds, as well as the "hollow ways" used by our Medieval ancestors to herd their cattle. The Bronze Age mounds must once have been prominent in the landscape, probably gleaming under a covering of chalk.

The smaller Iron Age barrows were excavated in the late 19th Century and some of the finds - a burial cart and some horse bits are in the British Museum. The hollow ways are Romano-British or early Medieval and are thought to have been used to drive cattle between summer and winter pastures. The June group meeting was devoted to a visit to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) St Martin's cemetery on Sloe Lane to find out more about the men buried in the 27 war graves located there. In addition to those commemorating the fallen of Beverley, there are a number of 'memorial' headstones dedicated to those with no known grave, or who are buried elsewhere, or who hailed from here and are recognised as such by the CWGC.

The visit was organised through the CWGC and led by one of their volunteer guides along with David Barton of Beverley & District u3a. David's passion is researching official war graves and his knowledge is encyclopaedic, something we all benefitted from. Those attending found it a chastening experience but came away with a fuller understanding of what the war graves represent, as well as an appreciation of the stories of the 27 now laying in peace, 100 years after their sacrifice.
