21st March 2024 1.30pm The Japanese Connection Speaker: Marie


An exploration of how Japanese Art and one particular artist from Japan influenced western painters, musicians and architects.

The Exhibition will have over 20 works by JMW Turner (1775-1851), one of Britain's greatest and most prolific painters including one of his most celebrated 'The Fighting Temeraire.'

The exhibition will be displayed across two of the Laing's galleries on the first floor, with sections exploring Turner's life and career, the role of the Temeraire itself, Turner's depiction of steamboats and industrial subjects, and the continuing story of the industrial landscape in art. Also included are other important pieces by artists including Tacita Dean, Chris Killip, L.S. Lowry, and James McNeill Whistler.


