## Friday 20<sup>th</sup> May Beadlam Grange Farm/ Helmsley.

Here, we have a one hour guided tour of the Hall and access to the gardens, restaurant, Dolls house exhibition, Teddy Bear house, Zimbabwean Sculpture Exhibition and finally, for those so inclined, the Adventure playground, miniature railway (£3 extra) and 25 minute boat ride (£5 extra). We should return to the Brit by approx 5.30. It should be noted that the walk from the gardens to the Hall takes approx 5 minutes.

Cost £33 to £36 approx, depending on numbers. A booking form will be available at the meeting on 20th June. Payment will be due at the meeting on 18th July. Friends and relatives are welcome if there are sufficient places.
