#### The venues coordinator's job

Having joined the Bolton u3a Committee in August 2018 and having booked rooms for 5 years, it is now time to hand over to someone else.

The main part of the venue co-ordinator's work is done early in the year and consists of finding out the room requirements of groups for the following year and booking the rooms with the various venues. Nearly all of this work can be carried out by email. I find the spreadsheet passed on to me by my predecessor very helpful in this process, and I will pass this invaluable document on to my successor. During the rest of the year I occasionally cancel or rearrange bookings and am on the lookout for new venues. I also make sure that we have a u3a risk assessment for the premises that we use and check the emergency evacuation procedures.

Why did I take on the job? Having enjoyed attending u3a groups for a year or two, and being aware of the mutual help nature of the u3a, I thought it was my turn to put something into the organisation and this looked like a job that I was suited to. I have enjoyed getting to know my fellow committee members, the group leaders and those working at the venues we use. By finding and visiting possible new venues I have got to know Bolton better. All in all, it has been rewarding and enjoyable. Do think about whether you could take over this role. An early volunteer could spend a few months working alongside me to become familiar with the role.



#### **Photo ID for voting**

Paul Dyson has compiled the following information to bring to our attention new legislation regarding photo ID and voting.

#### Local Elections 4 May 2023 – are you aware of this important change?

The following information has been extracted and adapted from Bolton Council's website. Further information can be found at: https://www.bolton.gov.uk/voting/voter-id

#### **Voter ID**

New legislation means that, beginning with the local elections on **4 May 2023**, everyone voting at a polling station will need to present a form of photographic ID. The types of acceptable ID are listed below.

Electors must still be registered to vote and must still attend the polling station shown on their poll card

The poll cards delivered to home addresses will be in a larger format this year and will give information about voter ID and will list the acceptable forms of photographic ID.

The following are forms of photographic ID allowed by the legislation and likely to be possessed by U3A members:

- Passport
- Driving licence
- ♦ A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass

If any of the above forms of ID are out of date, they are still acceptable at the polling station as long as the photo still looks like you.

#### **Voter Authority Certificate**

If you do not have any of the above forms of photographic ID, you can apply for a "Voter Authority Certificate". This is a form of letter with a photograph of you which can be used at a polling station.

You can apply for a VAC at: https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate, where there is further information about providing the photograph.

The deadline for applying for a Voter Authority Certificate for the May 2023 elections is **5pm on Tuesday 25 April.** 

#### Postal vote

The procedure for postal voting appears to be the same as in previous years. Anyone who is registered to vote can apply to vote by post. You do not have to give a reason.

The deadline to apply to vote by post in the elections to be held on 4 May 2023 is 5pm on Tuesday 18 April 2023.

#### **Proxy vote**

#### **IN OTHER NEWS**

#### **Request for volunteers from Bolton Newstalk**

Bolton Newstalk is a registered charity staffed entirely by volunteers. It was founded in the early 1970s to provide a regular, local talking newspaper for the blind, visually impaired and disabled members of the community. Such people can hear national and regional news on radio and TV, but miss out on local stories and news.

Since its foundation we have used all kinds of recording techniques from reel-to-reel tapes, CDs, USB memory sticks to the current format - podcasts. We are fortunate in having our own recording studio at the Sensory Centre, Thicketford, at the rear of the Tonge Moor Health Centre.

Prior to the covid pandemic, we used to record on a weekly basis, every Sunday afternoon, with a rota of programme producers, readers, and recording technicians. On the following Monday, teams of copiers would copy the master recording onto the memory sticks and send out to our listeners, via the Royal Mail's "freepost" system. Our customers would play the memory sticks on a small machine which we provided free of charge. After listening to the programme, they would return the USB via the same system. We also added the recording, as a podcast, to our website to be accessed by those who did not have a machine.

However, when the Covid pandemic struck, our *modus operandi* had to be changed completely, as we no longer had access to our recording studios at all. The main problem was how to effect a recording, but this was managed by those programme producers and readers who had smart phones whereby the recordings were done remotely and emailed to one of our technicians who then added it to the website as a podcast. As a member of the Talking News Federation, our national body, we could add these podcasts to an app available to the visually-impaired community and, additionally, available on the Alexa smart speakers.

However, although these facilities have increased our listener base, we have lost many of our volunteers - all our copying teams (as that service was no longer necessary), and all the readers and programme producers who were unable to do remote recordings as they didn't have the latest phone technology. But we have carried on with our programmes, albeit only recording every 2 weeks now, to ease the strain on our reduced programme producers and technicians.

As a reward for our work, we were fortunate to receive the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service (QAVS) in 2022 and were invited to attend the official reception at Bolton Town Hall for the recent Royal visit by King Charles and Queen Camilla.

To maintain our service, we are looking for volunteers to be readers, programme producers or technicians to spread the workload. If possible, we would also like to reintroduce the copying system to provide the programmes on the memory sticks to those who are unable to access the internet or don't have access to the app or smart speaker. If anyone is willing to volunteer, or knows someone who may be interested in joining our organisation, especially as a technician or a programme producer, I would be only too pleased to hear from them.
