Peter, the great-grandson of a suffragette Alice Hawkins told us the story of his relative's "inspirational" life. Alice Hawkins was originally a machinist at a boot maker in Leicester who fervently campaigned for equal pay before getting involved with the suffragette movement in the early 1900s. Although imprisoned several times she continued to fight on until her death in 1946.

Peter says: "Her life was fascinating, she wasn't your typical suffragette, she was a poor working-class socialist who joined the movement in her mid-40s".

What follows is the story of how he came to smuggle it back to Argentina and into the school, where it quickly became well loved by the staff and the boys and an important member of the school.
