### The Theme for 20th June meeting was Canals and Canal Boats.

There were a wide variety of paintings chosen, four located in Britain, two of the Grand Canal in Venice, and one of the opening of the Suez Canal. The normal choice of only one painting was extended as Monet had painted the same view of the Grand Canal, but with entirely different lighting according to the time of day. There were also two paintings of the opening of the Suez Canal. The first one was a small painting with rough strokes to position the outline of the attendants. The second one was much larger, in bold colours with all the dignitaries who were there.

### The Theme for 25th July was Fashion

The Red Dress Project was really interesting. A 14-year, award winning global, collaborative embroidery project from 2009 to 2023. It was conceived by British artist Kirstie Macleod and provided an artistic platform for women around the world. This project allows them to tell their personal stories through embroidery. Piet Mondrain's painting reminded us of the days when we wore dresses like Twiggy, bought in the Biba shop in London in the 60s and 70s. The Lobster Telephone by Salvador Dali was the most unusual choice for the meeting.
