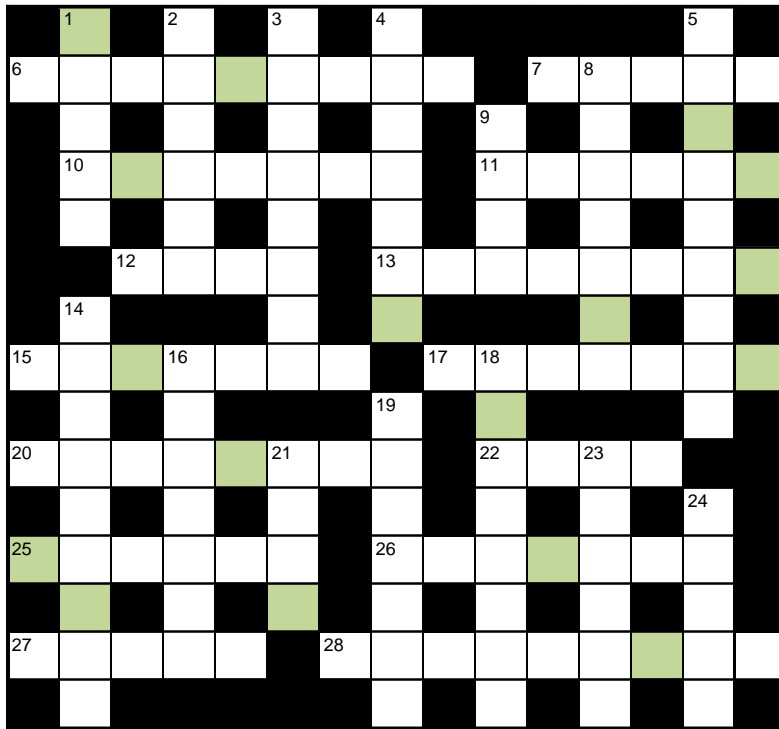


Branston U3A Crossword 35 – and Polyword
