We had been working towards participating in the nationwide U3A Open Day on June 3rd, but naturally that was cancelled, as has been the alternative date of October 1st, so we are now looking at sometime next year to showcase our offerings.

Meanwhile, we have been keeping in touch using weekly emails to all internet-connected Members, plus occasional Newsletters, and both of these have included quizzes and have given opportunities for members to contribute and to give feedback. In addition, phone contact has been maintained with as many Members as possible, especially to those living alone.

Having said all that, we are very much aware that there is a very real longing for things to get back as near normal as possible, especially in terms of being able to meet friends and attend meetings, so we look forward to being able to declare normal service as soon as possible, and we shall update you on progress when we are able to.
