BArts presents The Lord Chamberlain's Men in "Romeo and Juliet" by William Shakespeare, Outdoor Theatre in The Spotlight Gardens


The Lord Chamberlain's Men invite you to join them this

In the last three years of the C16, the Lord Chamberlain's Men became Shakespeare's most important company. He was their foremost dramatist and performed numerous parts on stage, too. The company's main theatre was the Globe, but they performed for Queen Elizabeth at court and also went on tour. Women were not allowed to appear on stage at this






