

Therefore, you will need to be proficient in the use of a computer/laptop/tablet and be willing to join and pay for a subscription to a genealogy website like Ancestry or Findmypast.

The group also has a WhatsApp group, where members can ask each other for help and share new discoveries in their research.

Tips and Tricks (Hilary Wrightman)

Useful Uses for Chalk

- 1. Rub chalk on a greasy or oily stain, leave for 10 minutes, wipe off surplus and wash.
- 2. Put some chalk sticks into your jewellery box or with your silver items to prevent tarnishing.
- 3. Hang a small net bag containing chalk in your wardrobe and drawers to absorb any moisture that might occur.
- 4. Rub chalk on the head of a screwdriver to prevent slipping when using.
- 5. Put some chalk into your toolbox or drawer to keep it rust free.
- 6. If you have some small dents or marks on wallpaper or paintwork, find some chalk a similar colour and rub over the marks.
- 7. Sprinkle some ground up chalk around windowsills and doors to stop ants coming in
- 8. Rub a piece of chalk over the teeth of a key that is used in a lock that keeps sticking, slide in and out a few times.
- 9. When hanging a frame, apply to the frame hanger, press against the wall and it will leave a mark allowing you to see exactly when the nail should go.

Mmm. Or was I that good? Or maybe, just maybe, she liked having me around. Okay. Okay I'll think up a more plausible explanation. Ha.



Members may remember my report on Transport for London's consultation on the curtailment of the No 549 bus and its replacement by the No W14 bus which will travel between Loughton through Buckhurst Hill to South Woodford and Snaresbrook and terminating at Whipps Cross.
