Choosing your courses

It is up to you to check that the courses you are interested in do not clash. The system will not prevent you booking courses that take place on the same day/time.

Booking your courses — Non-email members

For members who do not use email or who have not provided us with an email address, we shall use almost the same system as we did for the 2022–2023 Main Programme. We have posted these members a paper copy of this programme and a booking form with instruction on how to use the form and how to pay course fees. Please note that the booking form is only for the use of members without an email address.

Booking your courses — Members with an email address

Access to the Booking website

Current members for whom we have an email address will already have access to the u3a Canterbury booking website, <u>https://bookings.u3acanterbury.org.uk</u> This link takes you to the login page. Your username is your email address and hopefully, you still have the password you set when you first accessed the site. If you don't have your password, then click where it says, 'Forgotten your password' and you will be able to set up a new one. Please try this out before booking opens so that we can sort out any problems and minimise stress for all when actually trying to book courses.

Booking will open on TUESDAY 8 AUGUST, between 09:00 and 09:30

Before then, the only courses you will see on the booking website will be from the programme for 2022–23.

Using the Booking website

Once you have logged in you will be taken to a page 'How to book a course'. This page repeats the information below about the booking process. At the top right-hand side of the page there are either another 3 tabs or 3 little dots called Menu: 'Book a course', 'My Bookings' and 'Log Out'.

Book a course

Click the 'Book a course' tab. This page shows all the courses and activities displayed in calendar form. It automatically shows the current month. To move to the next month, find where it says 'today' at the top of the calendar and use the arrow pointing to the right to move forward a month. You can repeat this to find the month and year you want.

- Move down the page to find the course you want. It does not have to be the first session.
- On the right-hand side it will show the number of places available. If there are spaces, just click on the course name.
- Now move all the way to the bottom of the page. If you are using a touch-screen, be careful not to touch any other courses on your way down the page. This can be tricky on a phone or tablet.
- At the bottom of the page a box will show Selected events. This will show details of the course you have selected. **Check this**.
- If you have made a mistake, just navigate away and find the correct course.
- The quantity box will show 1. Do not change this. You cannot book places for other people except in special circumstances, see later.
- Now click the red box **BOOK**.

You will immediately see a note saying, "Your reservation has been processed". You will also receive an email to this effect.

Booking more courses

You then have the option to click **Make a new booking**. You may need to 'refresh' your screen before the site will let you make a new booking. We have found that some computers require you to move away from this page and come back again before you can repeat the booking process.

My bookings

Click the 'My bookings' tab. This page shows the courses you have booked and their status. Initially it will show as pending.

The next stage

Each booking must be confirmed manually by one of the courses team in the following few days and once this has been done, you will receive an email confirming your place. Your 'My bookings' will show that the booking has been confirmed.

Special cases

- 1. If you need to book a place on a course for a carer who is not a member of the u3a, then use the facility to book more than 1 place. Please email Angela to explain the situation.
- 2. <u>Members who share an email address</u>. The booking website can only recognise one of you. If you both want a place on the same course, then use the quantity box near the red Book box and change the 1 to 2. Do not just repeat the booking for a single place because this will be rejected. When you have made your bookings, please contact Angela to clarify who is booking which course.
- 3. Members do not need to apply for any course they are hosting as they are automatically members of the group if they so wish.
- Any group leader/tutor who runs 10 or more sessions of a course or activity in this Programme is entitled to attend the entirety of one course or activity from the Programme without charge. This will not be applied automatically, please contact Angela.

Waiting lists

The calendar on the booking website will show the number of available spaces on each course. If the course or activity you wish to book is full, please email Angela on attppett@u3acanterbury.org.uk and ask to join a Waiting list. There is a link to this email address on the booking website. Members are added to Waiting lists in the order that requests are received and places that become available are offered strictly in the same order. Last year most members who asked to join a Waiting list were eventually able to join their course.

Cancelling a booked place

If you book a course that you subsequently need to cancel, please contact Angela so that she can offer the place to the member at the top of the waiting list or make the place available to other members.

Attendance

Do make sure that you have noted the advertised dates, especially the start-date, of activities you have booked. If you are unable to take up your place, or will be absent for the first session, inform Angela **and** the course leader as soon as possible. If you miss the first two sessions of a course without explanation your place is likely to be offered to another member.

Other information

Please note that course or activity leaders will be advised of your telephone number and email address where available, to help them contact you. They will not release these details to anyone, including fellow group members, without your permission.

Course Fees

As agreed at the AGM, all courses in this programme incur a fee of £1.50 per session. The total fee for each course is shown in the programme. Approximately a week after booking has opened, we shall send invoices by email for the course fees due. We plan to send further invoices, probably weekly, for bookings made since the previous round of invoices.

Ways to pay

- 1. <u>By Credit or Debit card</u>. The invoice will include a link to a secure payment site where you will be able to pay your fees using a debit or credit card. We hope that many of you will wish to take advantage of this new facility.
- 2. <u>Online or in a branch of your bank</u>. Transfer your fees directly into the u3a Canterbury and District bank account. To do so you will need the following information about the u3a Canterbury and District bank account

Art History & Appreciation

A Selection of European Masters

MAXIMUM: 8, SESSIONS: 6

TUTOR / LEADER: Patricia Erskine-Hill

Description: Each session examines the life story and work of a major artist, his relationships and the milieu in which he worked. We look in turn at Velázquez, Picasso, Giovanni Bellini, Benvenuto Cellini, Salvador Dalí and the tragic Serf Painters of Imperial Russia. While Dalí was outrageously eccentric, Cellini murdered at least one man, and Picasso destroyed the women who loved him, each of these very different artists has left an extraordinary legacy.

Art Forgery and Famous Art Forgers

MAXIMUM: 11, SESSIONS: 10

TUTOR / LEADER: John Shirland

DESCRIPTION: The fascinating subject of art forgery goes back more than two thousand years, but this course concentrates on the late 19th to the early 21st centuries. In the introduction we will look at who, why, when and how, plus improvement in means of detection. Weeks 2 to 10 will focus on famous art forgers from Van Meegeren, de Hory & Keating to Beltracchi, Landis & Chang Dia-Chien.

Art Inspired By Nature

MAXIMUM: 15, SESSIONS: 6

TUTOR / LEADER: Ian Harrow

DESCRIPTION: Week 1 Introduction: Natural patterns as art inspiration with Michelangelo – Human, and Haeckel – Nature. Weeks 2–6 Art Nouveau – paintings & lithographs, interior design & architecture. Wildlife & Peter Scott. Power of Illustration – zoological & botanical. Nature photography & moving images. Finally, wild landscapes of the Canadian wilderness and art of Emily Carr.

DESCRIPTION: Through the biographies of French painters of this period, a study of how their work reflected the changing political scene; from the sturdy confidence of the French Baroque painting, through the playful frivolity of the Rococo to the serious Neo-Classical, and finishing with the emotional French Romantic and Realist Narrative. A French Prospective will begin with Poussin and Claude Lorraine in the 17th century and end with Corot, Millet and Courbet in the 19th.

MAXIMUM: 15, SESSIONS: 11

TUTOR / LEADER: John Shirland

DESCRIPTION: Painting from the other side of 'the pond' is not well known in the U.K. as few pictures have found their way into our gallery/museum collections. This course limits itself to painters from New England and the Eastern seaboard of the USA up to the Appalachian Mountains. Time span is 18th to 20th century. We will look at folk art, frontier paintings, realist/romantic paintings depicting the grandeur of the Far West, a session devoted to four women painters, and then the flowering of American Impressionism.

DESCRIPTION: A study of Spanish paintings through the biographies of native Spanish artists, or those who spent their artistic careers in Spain. There will be great names: El Greco, Velázquez, Murillo, Goya, Picasso and Dalí, but also Goncalves, Bermejo, Morales, Ribalta, Ribera, Zurbarán and Valdés Leal. There will be one woman—Sofonisba Anguisolla, and the course concludes with Sorolla and Miró.

DESCRIPTION: Without colour how dull would be our existence and our world! Week 1: Introduction: History of pigments & how they changed painters' palettes. Weeks 2 to 10 will look at paintings where artists concentrated on a certain colour of the spectrum/rainbow—red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo & violet, plus ochre, white & black.

Each week we will look at twelve pictures that inspired poems or relate to poems. We will consider faces & places; events, landscapes, music dance & games; seasons & creatures; myth & history, and empathy, sympathy & our emotions. Members will be able to familiarise themselves with the poetry which will be emailed to them week by week in advance.

An Introduction to Cryptic Crosswords

MAXIMUM: 10, SESSIONS: 8

DESCRIPTION: The course is intended for those with little or no experience of Cryptic Crosswords. It will involve 8 weekly sessions of 90 minutes each. In an informal and non-competitive atmosphere we shall explore the techniques of the setters and their favourite tricks and shall work on examples together. Attendance on the first few sessions is essential. Full course material will be provided.

Learn the basics of needle turn appliqué (by hand rather than machine) Appliqué is an ornamental needlework technique in which pieces of fabric in different shapes are sewn onto a larger piece to form a picture or pattern.

Aspects of Landscape Painting

MAXIMUM: 10, SESSIONS: 6

TUTOR / LEADER: Andy McNally

DESCRIPTION: Each session covers a subject (Shadows, Reflections, Perspective, Skies, Trees. Recession) in detail. The principles are applicable to any medium used, but the practical elements of the activity are most easily accomplished in the time available using watercolours. Therefore, participants will need to bring their own paints, brushes and watercolour paper (**not cartridge paper**). If you are unsure about anything, please contact the leader before signing up.

This was the most dangerous role amongst any of the Allied forces. To put it into perspective, more men were lost, by the RAF, in one night than during the entire Battle of Britain. For most of the War, this was the only meaningful way of taking the conflict to the enemy, and ultimately made a major contribution to the defeat of the Axis powers. The sacrifice of these brave airmen deserves to be understood and remembered. *Steven Tindall served for 30 years in the RAF, one of the highlights of which was operating the Lancaster bomber of the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight (BBMF).*
