**Queen Anne's House - FREE**

**There is a possibility of a FREE volunteer tour @ 12.00 pm on the day. Otherwise, I will be your guide, starting @ 12pm. I have visited the House in the past, and have a quite a good knowledge of the history of the Stuarts.**

The Queen's House in Greenwich is one of the most fascinating buildings in the country. It is architecturally important, and was built for Queen Anne of Denmark by her Husband James I. Famous for its former royal occupants and its vast art collection.

It is home to an incredible collection of art, featuring works by artists including Canaletto, Rembrandt and Gainsborough. You can also see the iconic Armada Portrait of Elizabeth I, commemorating the failed invasion of England by the Spanish Armada in the summer of 1588.

There is a great Hall at the heart of the House – a perfect cube, decorated with a delicate gold leaf ceiling fresco designed by Turner Prize-winning artist, Richard Wright. There is also a famous tulip Staircase.

**National Maritime Museum (free entry) - £3.50 for Guided Tour**

Explore some of the Museum's most prized – and lesser-known – objects on this guided tour @ 2pm for one hour.

Meet and greet a Fijian canoe; be chilled by tales of polar exploration; marvel at the oldest boat in our collection and learn about life at sea in the age of Nelson.

Audio headsets: we will be provided with headsets to allow us to clearly hear the guide.

The National Maritime Museum (NMM) is the largest maritime museum in Greenwich, London. The galleries and displays allow you to discover ships and boats of all shapes and sizes. Includes relics from the Titanic and the uniform that Horatio Nelson that was wearing when fatally wounded. There is also a number of exhibitions to explore. You are free to explore at your own leisure.

Meeting & Travel information:

I will meet you at London Bridge Station on Platform 4, to catch the train @ 10.48 am to Greenwich. (two stops, arriving 10.57am)

OR

If you are planning to go direct to Greenwich yourself

Take a train to London Bridge. Than change to Platform 4 for the train to Greenwich - two stops. Once you exit the station, turn left than at the bottom of the road turn right. Both buildings are located together on the right. (Same entrance).
