

A visit has been arranged for Thursday, 18th April.

Syon House is the spectacular London home of the Duke of Northumberland and was built in the sixteenth century on the site of Medieval Syon Abbey. The house has been in the family of the present owners for more than 400 years and is currently under the guardianship of Ralph Percy, the 12th Duke of Northumberland.

One of London's last great houses, Syon House is set in 200 acres of glorious 'Capability' Brown landscape and holds a wealth of art within its grand classical Robert Adam interiors. Its verdant tranquillity makes visitors feel they are deep in the countryside, yet it lies only nine miles from Charing Cross, in BRENTFORD.

The house includes a great hall based on a Roman basilica and a bedroom used by Queen Victoria. The 3rd Duke built the spectacular Great Conservatory in the 1820s and is thought to be the earliest of its kind in the country.

The gardens are Grade I listed, and include a collection of rare trees and plants, a rose garden and circular lakeside walk.

The concession price is £ 12.50 (payable in advance) which includes a guided tour of the House @ 12.30 pm which lasts approx. 90 minutes. No returns after 11 April 2024.

Syon House has limited accessibility, for those who find stairs difficult.
