We very recently had our Summer afternoon tea at Leafy Oak Nursery. **EXPLORING LONDON 2 Rosemary Trundell 01992 621155

Our July trip was a guided walk around Central Hackney. This was of particular interest to some of our group who grew up in or near Hackney.

We started our walk at St Augustine's Tower, which is the oldest building in Hackney, dating back to the 13th Century and all that remains of the parish church which was demolished in 1798. This was replaced by a Georgian church which was eventually

completed in 1813 and for a while the bells were rung in the old bell tower until the new bell tower was completed.

Another notable building on our walk is Sutton House built in 1535 by Sir Ralph Sadler, adopted son of Thomas Cromwell, who became Principal Secretary of State to Henry VIII. During the Victorian era, with the coming of the railway in 1850, many of the old buildings were replaced by streets of terraced housing.

In August we decided to stay local and visited the Royal Gunpowder Mills at Waltham Abbey. When we arrived we were taken round the site on a tractor trailer ride and our excellent guide explained what all the various buildings were used for. We were also lucky to see some of the abundant wildlife living on the site.

After coffee/tea and biscuits we were free to look round the exhibits and view a film about the history of gunpowder and also have a ride on the narrow gauge railway. The Royal Gunpowder Mills were in operation for over 300 years. Over the centuries the factory grew, adopting new technologies and expanding its workforce to meet the increasing demand for explosives and propellants. After the 2nd World War the establishment reopened as a top secret research establishment before finally closing in 1991.

For our July trip the group decided to have a summer lunch, we were very fortunate as on one of the few sunny days in July we met for a very enjoyable lunch at Three Lakes Restaurant at Westmill Farm.

The restaurant is situated overlooking the lake and rolling countryside, which provides a lovely outlook while eating the excellent food. Some of the group stayed on to enjoy the scenery and good weather in the outside seating area.

In August we booked a guided tour of Bruce Castle Museum. This 16th century manor house in Tottenham was originally owned by William Compton, a close friend of Henry VIII whose position in court was 'groom of the bed chamber'. In the early 19th century Roland Hill opened a school in the building and was joint headmaster, later leaving teaching to work for the Post Office, and

inventing the Penny Black postage. The lovely weather allowed some of the group to venture onto the roof to see the view of local landmarks including Ally Pally and the Spurs ground.

EXPLORING LONDON 4

The next planning meeting will be on **Wednesday 13th September 2023 from 11:00am** at St. Clements Church Hall. Limited parking in front of the Church.

In June we visited Armourers Hall near Moorgate. Our guide Peter Bateman had been clerk up until last year. We started in the Gold Drawing Room where, after refreshments and biscuits, Peter first gave a talk on the history of Livery Companies in general. He then concentrated on the past and present activities of the Armourers and Brasiers as well as the history of armour and its role in medieval warfare.

Peter encouraged group members to participate in the discussion and as usual the group did not fail to impress with their knowledge and interest. We learnt that the Hall is believed to be the oldest Livery Hall to exist on the present site in the City of London despite being substantially rebuilt in the 19th Century. Unlike other livery halls it was not damaged by the Blitz.

There were striking portraits of Ann Vavasour and Sir Henry Lee in the Drawing Room. Peter told us how Ann became the lover of Sir Henry Lee, Master of the Royal Armourers under Queen Elizabeth I. She lived a chequered life and despite being Maid of Honour to the Queen for a period she was also imprisoned in the Tower of London and later brought before the High Commission on a charge of bigamy.

The Livery Hall itself was due for major refurbishment the following day so it is likely that if we visit again it will be completely transformed from how we saw it on our visit. Peter explained the contents of the Hall and gave us an insight into the events of the Battle of Agincourt. It seems that Henry V was not the dashing Prince Hal depicted by Shakespeare but a cold, aloof man prone to acts of breathtaking cruelty and arrogance. Despite the defeat of the French at Agincourt Henry was not satisfied until all those taken prisoner were systematically put to death.

The Queen's House is famous today for its extraordinary art collection including works by were given studio space by Charles II.

**EXPLORING LONDON 5 John Durrant 07515 971162

On Tuesday 25th July we set out on a grey but dry day for two great visits. Relieved that the threatened tube strike had been lifted, we arrived at the National Army Museum for coffee and a visit to the recently refreshed exhibition galleries. These cover the role of the Army from the British Civil War to the modern day. Thoughts and ideas are explored, as well as real stories of real people. The way we think about the Army was also challenged, as well as our relationship with it. A thought provoking place to visit.

Refreshed by lunch, we walked a few minutes down Royal Hospital Road to the Chelsea Physic Garden. Celebrating its 350th anniversary this year and originally set up by the Worshipful Society of Apothecaries, its original purpose was to provide medicinal plants. It is the only Botanic garden collection focused entirely on medicine, herbal and useful plants.

Originally it was an outdoor classroom for training apprentice Apothecaries, who are known as pharmacists today. They were trained to identify different plants and to understand their uses. Today over 4,500 species are crammed into the 4 acre site, helping tell the story of humanity's relationship with plants. Our two Tour Guides were knowledgeable and friendly. Indeed Paula, who has guided us on several Blue Badge Tours, is a volunteer guide at the Garden, and picked out our visit especially. Thank you Paula.

Refreshed by more tea and in some cases cake, we returned to Cheshunt educated, informed and entertained by our day in London. Sir John Reith would be proud! I note that Mick Jagger held his 80th Birthday Bash at the Physic Garden last night, so perhaps we should add Cool to the list of its Attributes!
