#### **Chair's Annual Report 2023**

Cheshunt u3a, now in our thirteenth year, continues to be a vibrant organisation to which so many members voluntarily give their time organising activities, arranging meetings and dealing with all the administration requirements to make it run smoothly. Our membership numbers have seen strong growth following the pandemic and now exceed the level we were at in March 2020. As at March 2023 we have well in excess of 700 members.

I would like to thank all those members who continue to lead our extensive range of groups. I would especially like to thank those members who have replaced the previous leaders of groups where the previous leaders have been forced to step down due to health issues or for other reasons. The group leaders make their own decisions and we can only offer the opportunities those leaders are prepared to take on. If a group is full or does not operate the way you want it to then do, please, step forward yourself and start up a separate group. We continue to participate in a Group Sharing Agreement with several other local u3as which gives members the opportunity to enjoy further activities not usually provided by Cheshunt u3a.

As usual our monthly talks have covered all manner of things. We have been entertained by a butler to the royals, a retired Chartered Engineer, a spymaster and a retired Headteacher. Talks have covered Lasting Powers of Attorney, maritime heroes, highwaymen, and book publishing.

When our u3a started we held meetings in Wolsey Hall. However, the local Council were set on its closure, despite the representations made by your committee. We moved to the Laura Trott Centre because there is not another venue large enough for our meetings in the Cheshunt area. However, we must accept we now use what is a multi-purpose Hall which is really designed for sports activities. We have overcome the sound issues by investing in our own equipment and I must thank Stewart Walter, our Vice Chair for controlling the sound system at our meetings. The extremes of temperature in the Hall at certain times of the year is however not easily resolved. In the Winter it will be impossible to warm such a

large area sufficiently in time for our meetings. Similarly, in the Summer if we get extreme temperatures the Sports Hall will be very warm and there is only so much we can do to provide ventilation; unfortunately, air conditioning is not installed in the Sports Hall. I can only recommend you dress accordingly and bear in mind the meeting only lasts a couple of hours.

As a committee we feel it is important to maintain links with other local organisations so at the monthly meetings, along with the regular interest and group tables, we offer local community groups the opportunity to highlight their activities. These have included Cheshunt Fire Service, Park Run, and Three Valleys Male Choir. As well as providing information for our members it also makes others aware of what we do and the interests we have.

According to the Third Age Trust website nationally there are more than 1,000 u3as with more than 430,000 members. Each u3a is a mutual aid organisation, operationally independent but a member of the Third Age Trust, which requires adherence to the guiding principles of the u3a movement. The Trust reported the u3a turned 40 years old in 2022 and is 'fit for the future!' All u3as are encouraged to hold special events to raise the profile of our organisation. We are very grateful to Jacqui Fry for organising our stand at Tesco Brookfield Centre on 21st September 2022. The event was very well supported and helped encourage new members. Music was kindly provided by the A Team, a band of musicians which traces its formation to the Jazz Orchestra of Cheshunt u3a along with partnership arrangements with other u3a groups along the A10 corridor.

Cheshunt u3a could not operate successfully without the dedication and commitment shown by all of those serving on your committee and I thank them for all the unseen work they take on throughout the year.

Along with the committee I would also like to thank the Group Leaders who do such a good job in organising the activities so much enjoyed by the members. We remain grateful for the support we receive from the staff here at the Laura Trott centre. They have worked with us ever since we were forced to move from Wolsey Hall

in 2017, providing us with storage facilities and setting up the Sports Hall in accordance with our specifications. We have also called upon their First Aid support on several occasions.

And finally, every member plays a part in making this a pleasant and vibrant organisation to be part of. It is run by the members for the members. I believe this collective spirit will ensure Cheshunt u3a continues to be a place where people come to enjoy activities, make friends and help make it fun for everyone.

#### **EXPLORING LONDON 2** Rosemary Trundell 01992 621155

Our March trip was to the magnificent Mercers' Hall in the City of London. The Mercers' Company was formally incorporated in 1394 by a Royal Charter granted by Richard II. The Company was a trade guild representing the interests of members who exported woollens and imported silks, velvets, fine linens and other luxury fabrics. Richard Whittingham, William Caxton and Sir Thomas Gresham were among early members of the company.

By the 16<sup>th</sup> Century many members of the Company had lost any connection with the original trade and today the Company exists primarily as a charitable institution supporting a variety of causes. The present Mercers' Hall is the third to occupy the site. The first Hall burned to the ground in the Great Fire of London in 1666. The second Hall was destroyed during the Blitz of 1941. The present Hall was opened in 1958.

#### **EXPLORING LONDON 4**

Recently we visited the Museum of London Docklands Museum. Some of the group visited the Executions Exhibition which closes in the middle of April. It features a very detailed look at how public executions shaped Londoner's lives and the city's landscape over 700 years. It included interesting sections on Charles I execution orchestrated by Oliver Cromwell and his regicides and the fate that befell them later when Charles II was restored to the throne.

After lunch the whole group enjoyed a highlights tour with a very entertaining Museum Guide. It started in the introductory gallery of Warehouse No.1 and continued looking at the galleries such as 'Trade Expansion', London, Sugar & Slavery, Sailortown, The Docklands at War and finishing with the modern transformation of the London Docklands area and how this evolved. #### **EXPLORING LONDON 5** John Durrant 07515 971162

On 21<sup>st</sup> February a large group enjoyed an interesting and informative tour of Covent Garden. Home of the Royal Ballet, The Royal Opera and The Orchestra of the Royal Opera House, the current building is the third to occupy the site. The first, the Theatre Royal, Covent Garden, was completed in 1732 and was originally a playhouse. This was destroyed by fire in 1808, and was rebuilt, to be destroyed again by fire. The current building was opened in 1858, and underwent a large extension, which was completed in 1999. This added the adjacent Flower Market, now known as the Floral Hall.

We toured the Costume department, and learnt of the workshop and costume store in Thurrock. No costume is ever thrown away, and some of the oldest in regular use date from the 1960's. We watched members of The Royal Ballet rehearsing for the evening show, and were shown the magnificent auditorium. Tiers of boxes in a horseshoe shape provide fabulous views of the stage.

Finally we browsed the display of historic posters and programmes on display in the foyer of this famous London landmark.

On Thursday, 9<sup>th</sup> March we enjoyed a guided tour of the highlights of the Victoria and Albert Museum. Under the expert attention of our guide Paula, we were steered through the magnificent Parlour from the Old Palace in Bromley by Bow. Dating from 1606, the beautifully carved wooden panelling, the stone chimney-piece, featuring a frieze of carved birds and monsters, which were probably originally picked out in gold and colours, and the elaborate plasterwork ceiling are all magnificently preserved.

The magnificent plaster cast of Trajan's Column is one of the stars of the V&A collection, and has towered over the cast collection in two halves since the opening of the Courts in 1873. A monumental feat of moulding, electrotyping, casting and engineering, the column perfectly demonstrates the complexity and skill of copying in the 19th century.

Other highlights included a 1670 manicure set, featuring a tiny spoon for removing earwax, a tongue scraper and a toothpick. The Hereford Cathedral Choir screen, designed by George Gilbert Scott is a premier example of Victorian Gothic metalwork. It was removed and stored in packing cases until restoration began on 1997. It is now displayed in the Ironwork gallery.

The Great Bed of Ware created much interest, being made locally in the 1590's in the typical style of the period in carved wood. It has ropes rather than springs and reputedly slept 4 couples! Over 10 ft 8 inches wide, it is remarkable for it's large size. It is thought that an Innkeeper of Ware had it made as a curiosity to attract customers, as Ware is located 22 miles north of London, a day's journey from the capital on horseback or by coach. Mentioned by Shakespeare in Twelfth Night in 1601, and by Ben Johnson as 'The Great Bed of Ware' in a play of 1609, carved initials and red wax seals left by visitors may be seen on the bedposts and headboards today.
