

Leisurely Walks

Previous Walks

July - Crowell/Aston Rowant/Kingston Blount - 3.8 miles

On 25th July 2023, twenty of us set off for a walk around the villages of **Crowell, Aston Rowant and Kingston Blount** with people completing sections of the walk they felt comfortable with. This was a sociable event culminating at a local coffee shop.

June - Long Crendon/Notley Abbey - 3 miles

June found us walking from **Long Crendon to Knotley Abbey** which was founded in the 12th century. Excavations in 1937 established a layout and timeline of the building's construction. Henry V was known to have visited the abbey which was more recently owned by Laurence Olivier and Vivien Leigh. We enjoyed this lovely walk which ended in a very nice coffee shop.

May - Hambleden along the Thames

Hambleden was the start of the May walk led by Peter Gibbons, following an easy stile-free walk on paths and lanes. Total ascent 20m/60ft it was a lovely short walk with one of the more unusual crossings of the Thames and beautiful views.

January - Town walk around Watlington - 2 miles

January walk from Watlington was led by Gill Taylor. This was a 2 mile walk around the historic market town of Watlington taking approximately 1 to 1.5 hours taking in the Church and recognising Midsommer Murder locations etc. No hills, no stiles and no mud! Refreshments at the coffee shop after the walk.
