CHINNOR & PRINCES RISBOROUGH RAILWAY

On what was possibly one of the hottest days in August, we were visiting the Chinnor & Princes Risborough Railway (C&PRR). Unfortunately, we were unable to get a place on Joy's coach, therefore we made our own way to Chinnor. The coach party stopped at Wendover for a lunch and a browse before proceeding to Chinnor. Arriving early before the coach we had time for a walk and found the C&PRR maintenance yard. One of the volunteers invited us in and gave a brief tour around the yard. Currently, the volunteers are restoring a carriage and a mobile crane, besides working on routine running repairs. Up to 300 volunteers give at least one day a month in running and maintaining the C&PRR.

Back at the Chinnor station our party awaited the arrival of our steam train. In the true tradition of railways, our train was running late – well, it wasn't a clockwork train! However, we boarded our carriages and set off to steam along the Icknield Line, through the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire countryside, while enjoying our cream scones and tea/coffee. At Princes Risborough, the steam locomotive was unhooked, driven to the other end of the carriages and recoupled for the return journey.

On the whole a very pleasant outing and I believe everyone enjoyed themselves.
