#### Wings & Wheels Group - Midland Air Museum

This fascinating Museum, based at Coventry Airport, is for Aero enthusiasts, those interested in 20th Century History and those who want a fun and informative day out alike. The Museum houses a significant number of aircraft, essentially of UK manufacture, but also including American and Russian heritage.

Under supervision, we were allowed to clamber up ladders into the cockpit area of a Vulcan "V" Bomber (made by AVRO) which in the 1960s carried the Blue Steel Missile as the UK main Nuclear deterrent. The 2 pilots and 3 support crew worked for hours on end in very cramped conditions with basic "facilities". The Vulcan was only used in anger once when one aircraft flew the 16 hour round trip to bomb the airfield at Port Stanley during the Falklands War in 1982. We were also allowed to get into a Victor "V" Bomber cockpit which was surprisingly easier to enter and had more space for the pilots and bomb aimer than the Vulcan. The Victor was manufactured by our very own Handley Page Aircraft Company at Park Street!



The Museum has a substantial number of aircraft exhibits, in various states of renovation, both inside, outside and in an adjacent hanger. A large part of the exhibition is also devoted to Aero Engines and in particular to Air Commodore Sir Frank Whittle who is credited with the invention of the turbojet engine. This led to the "jet age" for both Military and Civilian Aircraft following the World War II. Many engines were on display as well as hundreds of aircraft models both in cabinets and hanging from the ceilings in a number of exhibition rooms.

The Museum is run exclusively by volunteers including one who clambered into the Victor cockpit with us, to explain the process of flying the original operational aircraft. He was aged 95! Another great trip out for the Group.

#### Embracing the joy on two wheels

"Two wheels, one passion" – that's the motto of the Cycling Group whose monthly rides have proved to be a ticket to adventure. Whether exploring the Hertfordshire countryside or further afield, our intrepid riders have found the rides a great way to keep healthy in body and mind, make new friends and avoid leaving a carbon footprint in some of nature's most beautiful spots.

Most of the group have now acquired



electric bikes which are environmentally friendly, easy to operate, help you to manage hills and travel longer distances. Another bonus - outside peak hours, you can also take them on trains at no extra cost. This has meant being able to start rides at places like Bedford, Sandy or Milton Keynes. Taking advantage of a cost-saving group rail ticket, our October ride took us from St Albans City station to West Hampstead Thameslink before joining the London Overground to Richmond. Lifts at all the key stations meant we didn't have to haul the bikes up and down the stairs.

The day began with a ride along the traffic-free Thames path, then across Ham Common into Richmond Park. It was the deer rutting season and we were able to get up fairly close to some of the one thousand free-roaming red and fallow deer. Little did we know when we heard the roar of the red stags that 30 miles away back in St Albans, everyone was experiencing a much more frightening sound – the boom of thunder as the heavens had opened with lightning strikes causing power cuts. We didn't have a drop of rain!

If you'd like to give cycling a try, we would love to welcome new members. You don't have to be an experienced rider. We take our time and enjoy many stops along the way, normally including one for lunch. Adventure awaits on two wheels!
