Some 16 members of the Local Events Group met at the Prae Wood Arms to share a Christmas lunch together early in December. The food was very good, and the chat and laughter were excellent.

A SAILING EXPERIENCE—Brian Stow

In the seventies, I sailed racing catamarans - Olympic Tornados and 18ft Darts. The Dart is 18ft long and 7ft wide with a 26ft mast fully battened sail (acts more like an aircraft wing) and single trapeze (for the crew). The Olympic Tornado is slightly larger with twin trapeze (crew and helm). In a strong wind both achieve about 30 mph which is a frightening speed.

We were racing my Dart in a near gale with the crew on trapeze and me hanging over the side and the windward hull flying about 3-4ft out of the water. At this speed and wind, the helm (me) must keep the leeward hull (the hull in the water) above the waves at the bow or that hull will stop suddenly. As the bow under water has stopped and the rest of the boat is attached to it, it stops, rises into the air sending crew flying, in my case about 20 ft high and forward of the boat. The crew was still attached to the top of the mast by the trapeze wire and landed well in front of me. Meanwhile the boat finished totally upside down. The fun now begins as we try to get it in the upright position, having swum back to an upturned hull.

Both of us have to get onto the back of one of the hulls which tips the boat slightly and the mast which floats, slowly brings the boat back onto its side, which from the water resembles a block of flats. The helm now crawls onto the hull in the water and explains to the crew that the two handles underneath the boat on the trampoline are for him to hold onto, which stops the boat going right over again, as I bring it up. He replies with a little nervousness in his voice "That means I will be underneath the boat". "Yes" I reply "just hold your breath for a bit then come up with me". I cannot quote his answer! Anyway, helm throws a jib sheet (rope) over the boat and hanging onto it leans far back; this brings the boat upright at last and dunks me in as well.

Now the boat is upright we now have to get into it quickly as it will sail off on its own leaving us behind. All the others in the race have sailed off into the distance. It is a lesson in righting an capsized boat. Finally, I was watching the catamarans on television at the last Olympics and thought "They must be mad" and then I realized I did that.
