### **Paul Allen Knowledge and Outreach Coordinator at CAT**

Having trained as an electrical and electronic engineer, Paul has worked with renewable energy technologies for over 30 years. He has led the ground-breaking [Zero Carbon Britain](#) research at CAT for 15 years, liaising directly with Government, business and the public sector.

### **Dr Judith Thornton**

Judith works at the [Institute of Biological, Environmental and Rural Sciences, Aberystwyth University](#). She has an interest in plants as building materials, and the carbon impact of materials more generally. She has previously worked at the Centre for Alternative Technology managing their water and sewage systems.

### **Isaac Beevor Climate Emergency UK**

Isaac is one of a small number of staff at [Climate Emergency UK](#). This organisation was set up in response to the climate emergency declarations that councils started making from the end of 2018. All UK councils' written Climate Action Plans have been assessed and scored, creating the Council Climate Plan Scorecards. Isaac started working and campaigning in local climate policy in Vancouver, managing volunteers and working on campaigns to support Vancouver's low-emission buildings policy and introducing an annual measuring and reporting system across the city.

### **John Baxter u3a Subject Advisor for Climate Change and Environment**
