The language of 'Waste' is changing.


- Throw it away!

We all create waste

No matter how hard we try, we all create some waste.

How much do you think you waste in a year (in weight)?

That's all the things like garden waste, packaging, clothes, leftover food and broken/old stuff that end up in all your curbside bins/bags.






How much do YOU waste a









26.4 million tonnes?

That's nearly 116 times the weight of the world's largest cruise ship!




A large 3 bed house

Symphony of the Seas only weighs 228,000 tonnes!



How much is recycled?

The UK recycled, reused or composted over **12.2 million tonnes** of that waste last year. This gives an overall recycling/composting/ reuse rate of **46.2%**.



England	45.5%
N. Ireland	50.6%
Scotland	44.9%
Wales	56.4%



The future?

The **2020 target was 50%,** so we're lagging behind. Future EU Circular Economy targets will require even more work!



Less waste means **less emissions** and **less cost** to the public too, so it makes sense for all of us to **reduce, reuse and recycle** more.



What's in YOUR general waste bin?

Studies are regularly done in local authorities to see exactly what gets put into people's general waste bins.






Inside the average residual waste bin (England, 2017 WRAP data)





Which method is best?













If in doubt, keep it out!


