MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR – March 2024

The year 'marches' on; into the third month already and spring is around the corner, with the clocks going forward at the end of the month! Yet again there are some changes and important information to note in this newsletter, so please read carefully.

<u>Communications / Data protection</u>. As you will remember, in January we set up a new generic email address that will be published in all documentation regarding Cottingham u3a. This has been monitored on a daily basis and is working well, with all queries answered quickly.

The new email address is cottinghamu3as@gmail.com

In addition, we have now purchased a mobile telephone and this is held by committee members on a rota basis. This number will also be published in all documentation regarding Cottingham u3a.

The new u3a mobile telephone number is 07586 532964.

Anyone ringing this number will be able to speak to a committee member or, if they are not available to answer immediately, the caller can leave a message that will be picked up as soon as possible. By taking the above two measures, we are hoping to eliminate completely the use of personal data in all public correspondence. I will reiterate that this does NOT mean that members cannot pass on their 'phone number/email address to other members, eg those in interest groups etc. That is still an individual choice.

Membership Renewal. The membership form has been updated and there is an additional new form for members to complete with their emergency contact details (very important that we have these). Please read the important article from Karen Baker, Membership Secretary.

<u>Committee Vacancies</u>. As many of you are aware we will be losing two key people from your u3a committee in September (it will be here before we realise it). David Groom has held the role of

Treasurer for the last few years, as well as looking after Cottingham u3a website and Beacon (database); Judi Groom has been our Hospitality Co-ordinator for several years and the majority of you will have benefited from her service in providing refreshments on some occasion or another, and not just the monthly meetings!! Therefore, we are now looking for people to take on these roles. Other than the role of treasurer, you do not have to be a member of the committee (although it does help with organising).

We have had one member of the u3a step forward and volunteer (with a bit of arm-twisting perhaps!) to take on one of the tasks; **Paul Tempest** has agreed to take on the administration of the **Beacon system** (the database that holds all of your personal data).

PLEASE would you think seriously about the other roles that will be vacant; failure to fill these will have a detrimental impact on the work of the committee and ultimately members' enjoyment at meetings, events and activities. To reiterate, the roles to be filled are:

- **Treasurer**: you do NOT have to be a trained accountant; it is not that onerous a task;
- Website manager: some IT knowledge would be helpful; and
- **Hospitality Co-ordinator**: Judi has produced a brilliant step-by-step guide to all events covered by this role, so whoever takes it on will be well supported indeed. This could be taken on by a group of members with one person acting as co-ordinator.

Holiday Discount. I thought that might grab your attention! A member has informed me that u3a members can obtain a 5% discount when booking a Fred Olsen cruise. U3A PODCAST

A friend recently asked "Do you listen to podcasts?" The answer was "I listen to lots".

You might ask "What are podcasts?"

Podcasts are digital audio programs consisting of a series of audio episodes that you can download from the internet – it works very much like a radio show, but you can listen to a podcast anytime you want. It might sound complicated but it really is very straightforward.

Podcasts allow you to listen to content from around the world – and they are **FREE**. Listeners decide exactly **what** they would like to listen to and **when** they want to listen to it!!

All you need to do is download a Podcast app eg Applepodcasts, Overcast, Pocketcasts, then search for the show/podcast that you want.

The point of this article is that I have recently come across the **'u3a podcast'** – which provides a fascinating glimpse into the lives of u3a members – well worth a listen!
