## New Group: Exploring Local History

Venue: Crawley Museum

**Duration:** Monthly, second Friday of each month / 11.00 – 13.00 2 terms

**Cost:** £2 per session

**Group size:** 15-20

**Outcomes:** Group members will be given the opportunity to:

- Access and examine a range of objects and materials (artifacts) from the Museum collections;
- Explore the nature and scope of local history, and how local history can help with the understanding of wider national events;
- Undertake their own research into aspects of local history, and present their findings in a number of ways.

**Methods:** Group leader input, group discussion and small group work, input from outside experts and enthusiasts, group presentations, exploring the Museum collections.

**Content:** The exact content of the sessions will be open to discussion to meet group interests, but will cover areas such as:

- What is 'local' history?
- How to research local history, using primary and secondary sources
- The use of artifacts such as photographs, documents, diaries and memoirs, using oral history, examining buildings and wider environment.

### Out & About 7's outing to Fort Nelson and Southwick House on 10<sup>th</sup> October

Out & About 7 enjoyed a visit to Southwick House and Fort Nelson on 10<sup>th</sup> October.

Southwick House is an operational military base where the group visited the map room where in 1944, Eisenhower, Montgomery and Admiral Ramsey coordinated the Normandy Landings.

Next stop was Fort Nelson – The Royal Armouries, housed in a fully restored Victorian fort – with panoramic views across Portsmouth and the Channel with a collection of over 700 artillery pieces: there is a gigantic 200-tonne railway howitzer, and parts of the infamous Iraqi supergun. The group also explored the kitchen and barracks to discover what life was like for the average Victorian soldier living at Fort Nelson.
