News from the Groups GARDEN DESIGN GROUP

Garden Design is run fortnightly on Wednesday mornings from 10 - 12 and takes place at my home in Sanderstead, South Croydon. It is for people who have an interest in finding out how to make their garden (or a section of it) more attractive. The next course (this consists of about 9 sessions) will start at the beginning of February. There are 3 places left. Please contact me (details below) if you would like to join or want further information.

A land surveyor friend of mine employs CAD to make a plan of your property, using local maps. You will then be able to start the course with a 'to-scale' outline of your house & garden and use it as a basis for revising the existing layout.

A 'film show' each session will help you understand how good design works. The aim is to enable you to draw up a plan of how you want to change your garden. Don't worry if you're not an expert drawer – artist standard is not required.

Subsequently, with the assistance of illustrations, you will be able to create a planting scheme for your redesigned garden.

If interested in joining a group, you would need the following

- 4 1 x 2B pencil,
- 4 1 x H or HB pencil,
- an eraser,
- photo/s of your garden or the area/s you would like to change.
- ♣ You will eventually need a disposable drawing pen which
 I will provide for approximately £3.00.

There will be a small cost (about £15) at the end of the course for tracing paper, printing hand-outs & plans, tea/coffee.

I'm writing this the day after our December General Meeting, so Christmas isn't yet over, but here's how I've fared so far. I've managed to totally avoid plastic in cards, wrapping paper, Christmas tree and decorations. All were either re-used or plastic-free.

Presents:- just one with plastic. The rest were either bought with care to exclude plastic, or weren't physical presents (subscriptions, gift cards, charity initiatives, etc.)

Food was the area where I conceded some things are not possible currently. Coincidentally, currants were one of them! I searched far and wide for them, and actually located a refill shop which should have had them, but didn't. Other unavoidable items were: Christmas pudding, chopped peel, glacé cherries, marzipan and icing. All other food bought specially for Christmas came without plastic - much of it delivered by a company who do organic boxes.



General Information and Booking terms and conditions

Payments and Refunds: For confirmed bookings all cheques must be cleared one week before the trip. A refund will only be payable for cancelled bookings if we are able to resell the place. Anyone taking the place of a cancelled booking must pay by bank transfer before the event or cash on the day.

Mobility Requirements: A member of the Travel Team will investigate any problems of access at the venue before bookings are opened. Members who are worried about mobility issues should contact the organiser before making the booking. Members with restricted mobility may be accompanied by a carer to any meal but a place needs to be booked. The carer does not have to be a u3a member but will be required to pay the full cost.

Your responsibilities: All attendees must carry out their own risk assessment.

WINTER WARMER: THE HOT WATER BOTTLE

Do you love a hot water bottle? Do you hug it, put it behind your back or on your feet? Did you know they are designed to last up to three years? They degrade over time and they can split.

Here's how to check the age of your bottle -

On the funnel of your hot water bottle, there should be a small flower motif embedded on to one side. This daisy sign will have a number in the middle signifying the year that it was made.

Around the number are 12 petals, one for each month of the year and inside those petals will be some dots. The dots, which can have up to four in each petal, are to demonstrate the week of the month that it was made.

So, if your hot water only has one dot in the first petal, then that shows it was made in the first week of January. If it has 13 dots in four petals, then it means the first week of April.
