

(1st Mon pm. Members homes) For our January tasting we met at the home of Teri and Gary Larson to sample a selection of wines from the West Coast of the United States. We started by comparing two 2021 California Chardonnays – a powerful, rich wine from Santa Barbara and a lighter, fruitier example from Clay Creek, just east of San Francisco Bay. This was followed by a refreshing 2022 Washington State Riesling and a vibrant, crisp 2022 Sauvignon Blanc from the Napa Valley. All the red wines we tasted were from California:– a cool climate 2021 Pinot Noir from Monterey, a rich 2020 Merlot, two Cabernet Sauvignons – an elegant example from Sonoma County and a more generic approachable Apothic, then to finish two classic 2020 full-bodied Zinfandels.

Whilst all the bottles were of a high quality it was intriguing to see how wines made from the same grape in the same year in the same state had such contrasting flavours. Thank you, Gary and Teri for a delightful evening.
