(4th The Royal Castle Hotel – Library Room) The Noble Rotters met for a tasting of seven English wines on 26th October. 11 members attended. We kicked off with a Bramble Hill Sparkling Wine. (£14 – M and S). This was a very drinkable bubbly enjoyed by all. However, £14 was thought to be a bit pricey for an everyday fizz.

We then sampled a Balfour Chardonnay. (£14 - M and S). Generally this was not a hit. Felt it was lacking depth, tasted watered down and certainly overpriced.

Next was a blind tasting of a Nettle Wine. (£12.50 – Inspirations Brixham). A few hints were needed before nettles were mentioned. This was a fairly sweet wine mostly enjoyed for the novelty value.

The fourth bottle was a Pink Lily Rose (\pounds 12, but on offer for \pounds 6 – M and S). This was very well received. It was fruity and fresh with a lot of flavour and at \pounds 6 a great price.

We then tried a Little Bee Orange Wine (£18.95 - Dartmouth Wine Company). This was a Sharpham *pinot gris*. For most this was a disappointing wine with an unusual taste and certainly not value for money.

The sixth wine was a Sharpham *Pinot Noir*. (£20 - Michael Sutton). We all liked this wine. Definitely one to buy if you'd like a treat.

Last was a blind tasting of a Black Beer and Raisin Wine (£13.50 - Inspirations Brixham). There were very mixed opinions about this wine. Cough mixture, port, sherry and caramel were all mentioned.

Members homes (1st Mon pm) Paul Noonan, our host for the October Tasting, chose as his theme "Wines of Italy". As an introduction to the evening Paul selected an upmarket Valdobbiadene Prosecco Superiore from the Dartmouth Wine Company – a lightly sparkling wine with an elegant finish. This was followed by two excellent Wine Society still dry white wines, – a fruity Langhe Favorita from Piemonte and a Zibibbo (aka Muscat!) from coastal Sicily with an unusually salty minerality.

We then tasted seven red wines from across the length and breadth of the country – a *Negroamaro* and a *Susumaniello* from Puglia, a *Montepulciano D'Abruzzo* from Pescara on the Adriatic, a *Cannonau* (aka Grenache) from Sardinia, a *Sangiovese* from Toscana, and finally a *Barbera* and a *Barolo Riserva* (2014) from Piemonte. The *Barolo*, available at the bargain price of £16 from Lidl, and the *Santodeno Negroamaro* (2021) from Sainsbury's at £9 were the favourites.
