We very recently received the following message from the National u3a, who distribute Third Age Matters magazine:

"We have been advised today that the company who handle the data transfer portal for the Third Age Matters Magazine has gone into liquidation. In accordance with our data transfer TAM portal privacy policy which allows us to hold data for 90 days – we will use submitted data for November to dispatch your TAM magazines as the January submission window for the magazine. In the meantime we will source a solution for collecting data for future editions of the magazine. Thank you for your understanding and patience with this slight change in our normal procedure. We will keep you and your Chair informed of any changes moving forward."

This is unlikely to affect many of our Derby u3a members, except those who have requested not to receive it in any more, new members, and those who have not renewed their membership.

Just like Marmite, the book divided the group, very appropriate for a book by a food critic!, so the overall score was 2.9 out of 5.
