



Easter—This year Easter Sunday is 9th April

Easter is a Christian holiday that celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In the New Testament, the event is said to have occurred three days after Jesus was crucified by the Romans and died in roughly 30 A.D. The holiday concludes the "Passion of Christ," a series of events and holidays that begins with Lent—a 40-day period of fasting, prayer and sacrifice—and ends with Holy Week, which includes Holy Thursday (the celebration of Jesus' Last Supper with his 12 Apostles, also known as "Maundy Thursday"), Good Friday (on which Jesus' crucifixion is observed) and Easter Sunday. Although a holiday of high religious significance in the Christian faith, many traditions associated with Easter date back to pre-Christian, pagan times.

Originally the eating of eggs was not allowed by church leaders during the week leading up to Easter (known as Holy Week) so any eggs laid that week were saved and decorated to make them Holy Week eggs, that were given

to children as gifts. Victorians adapted the tradition with satin-covered cardboard eggs filled with Easter gifts. This has now developed into the tradition that many people enjoy today. The first chocolate eggs appeared in France and Germany in the 19th Century, but they were bitter and hard. As chocolate-making techniques improved, hollow eggs like the ones we have today were developed. The first hollow chocolate Easter eggs to be sold in the UK were released by Fry's in 1873.

The story of the Easter Bunny is connected to Pagan tradition, and is thought to have become common in the 19th Century. Rabbits usually give birth to a large litter of babies which are seen as a symbol of new life. In Germany in the 1700s children would build nests, and leave carrots out for the "Osterhase" - the Easter bunny. Legend has it that the Easter Bunny lays, decorates and hides eggs for good children—hence the tradition of Easter Egg Hunts.

Easter is a "moveable feast" between 22nd March and 25th April which falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon occurring on or after the spring equinox.
