



#### The Discussion Group

# The group meets every Friday at 9:30 am in the Driffield Community Centre All u3a members are welcome to join us

We used to be the Study and Discussion group. It sounds a bit "back to school", doesn't it? Perhaps it is. I don't think any of us are too old to learn something new. This group has been

part of the Driffield and Wolds u3a for about 20 years now and we still find interesting things to talk about. So what do we do? We meet once a week in the spring, autumn and winter with a break for the summer, and we talk about things. What kind of things? Over the 5 years that I have been a member we have discussed history, art, science, medicine, books, poetry, mathematics, politics, our heroes...and pretty well anything we can think of.

As the Study and Discussion Group we often started our meetings by having someone talk about something for half an hour or so. Then we'd discuss it. What we have found is that we tend to enjoy the discussion a lot more than the "lecture" so now we just go straight to the discussion. From now on we are the Discussion Group.

We no longer have a set format for our meetings. If we've chosen a topic where one of us thinks he or she is an expert, then they might talk about it for 5 or 10 minutes before we discuss it but usually we'll just launch into a discussion. One thing is almost guaranteed: the discussion will range far beyond what we originally intended. I've certainly learnt things. I would say I learn something new every week, even if it's that everybody is wrong except me!

Have a look at our programme for the coming weeks and see if there's anything that grabs your interest. I should say though, that we nearly always end up discussing a much wider range of stuff than the topic implies.

Do you fancy joining in? If you do you'll be most welcome. You shouldn't feel daunted. We don't all feel we have to contribute every week. Indeed, sometimes I just sit and listen for the entire meeting. And we're not a bunch of intellectuals. Well, I think I'm an intellectual but somebody usually puts me right.

#### The Group is enjoying a Summer Holiday and will be back in action in September!

**15 September: Happiness**—What makes us happy? Friends? Family? Security? Wealth? Achievements? Academic studies often find that people think they are less happy than they used to be. Is this true? Is the pursuit of happiness futile?

**22 September: Power hungry**—There are proposals to ban petrol powered cars and rely on electric ones. Similarly there are plans to replace gas boilers with heat pumps for domestic heating. Can our electricity supply system cope? What are the consequences if it can't?

**29 September: The NHS**—This year is the 75th anniversary of the foundation of the NHS. Is it still doing a good job? Was it ever? If it isn't, what's the reason? What are the implications for people who need long term care?

**6 October: In our Time**—The BBC has hundreds of episodes of its radio 4 programme "In our time" available on BBC Sounds (used to be iPlayer). It's a discussion programme chaired by Melvyn Bragg and it covers a wide range of topics: art, sciences, religion, history etc. A bit like our discussion group, but perhaps not so learned. A group member will suggest an episode for the rest of us to talk about. We can even listen to it beforehand if we want.

**13 October: What have the Romans done for us? -** They've influenced our language, our laws and our transport systems. Or have they? Would we have developed much the same society without their influence?

**20 October: What did the Normans do for us? -** ...apart from invading and taking over. Arguably their influence is more recent than the Romans' and maybe it's therefore more important. I'm sure one of us will know and the rest will argue with them.

**27 October: Big numbers**—We're all bamboozled by big numbers. Anything more than a thousand and our brains struggle to cope with appreciating the size of it. How do we express numbers once we get past a trillion? How many grains of sand are there on a beach? Can you think of a number that no one else ever has? (Yes. It's easy)

**3 November: Member's choice**—A group member will suggest a topic for us to discuss. No prior warning given. A bit like in our time but you don't have to listen to a radio programme.

**10 November: Unintended consequences**—Decisions have consequences. Sometimes they are what we expect, but sometimes you get something entirely different. If governments do this the outcome can be serious. We'll discuss a few examples, and I'm sure members will bring their own examples.

**17 November: Forgiveness**—People do bad things and are punished. Sometimes it doesn't end there. The person might lose their job, their family and friends, and their reputation. As a society should we be more forgiving? Or do wrongdoers get what they deserve?

**24 November: Prison and punishment**—Imprisonment has been used as a punishment for hundreds, if not thousands of years. Is there a better way of dealing with those who offend?

**1 December: Sainthood**—If you had the power, is there anybody you would nominate for Sainthood? What do you think it means for somebody to be a saint?

## **August Birth Flowers—Gladioli and Poppies**



The gladiolus flower is the traditional flower of a 40th wedding anniversary, symbolising faithfulness and infatuation. They are also said to represent integrity and strength of character. They can also symbolise different things, depending on their colour.

A white gladiolus symbolises purity.

Yellow gladioli convey happiness and friendship.

A pink gladiolus symbolises non-romantic love.

A red gladiolus symbolises deep love

As well as being traditional symbols of remembrance, poppy flowers are also said to represent imagination, dreams, regeneration and luxury.

The yellow poppy symbolises success

The orange poppy represents health and wellbeing

The pink poppy expresses non-romantic love

The white poppy conveys sympathy
