The birth flower for July is the delphinium, also known as larkspur. There are over 400 different varieties and some can grow up to 6 feet tall! Delphiniums are said to symbolize joy, warmth

and fun but, as with every flower, the colours play an important part in their meanings. Dark blue delphiniums represent dignity, while white, pink and light blue delphiniums mean youth and renewal.

Water lilies are another July birth month flower. These exotic flowers are native to the Amazon region. They have different meanings in many cultures but mainly represent rebirth and enlightenment.





Tuesday 25th July—Shibden Hall and Piece Hall, Halifax - £28 per person



Shibden Hall's architecture is a mix of styles reflecting its interesting and varied history. The adjacent 17th century aisled barn and workshops house a carriage collection and displays relating to different crafts, including a blacksmiths, coopers, wheelwrights and saddlers.

The Hall is surrounded by the beautifully restored gardens and estate that forms Shibden Park. There are a range of features and attractions, including a cafe and visitor facilities, miniature railway, boating lake, walking trails, play area, orient-eering course and woodland in which to roam. Shibden Hall is the focus of the

BBC drama series written by Sally Wainwright, 'Gentleman Jack' exploring the life of Anne Lister (1791 - 1840) and those who lived in the Hall and Estate. The first series aired in 2019 and the second series in 2022.

The Piece Hall in Halifax is a unique Grade I listed building dating back to 1779, originally built to support the trading of 'pieces' of cloth and now reimagined as a new heritage and cultural destination. Home to one of the most striking piazzas in Europe, the stunning Georgian trading hall hosts independent shops, cafés, galleries, bars and heritage spaces. A year-round events programme attracts visitors from far and wide for concerts, street performance, spectacles, film screenings and much more. The Piece Hall is the only surviving intact cloth hall in the UK and an iconic symbol of the important role played by Georgian Halifax at the booming centre of the world's woollen trade.

Take a stroll in he Arboretum, enjoy the wonderful Bird of Prey displays, or hand feed the wallabies in the Mammal Centre. There is a lot on offer including fun seasonal trails. 100 acres of beautiful Arboretum and woodland gardens with one of the finest collections of trees in the North of England a leading centre for raptor conservation.

Full Buck Moon

The next full moon, the seventh of the year, will rise on July 3rd and will peak at

0038am on the 4th. Generally known as the 'Buck Moon' because male deer, who shed their antlers every year, begin to regrow them in July. It is also known as the thunder moon, due to the summer storms and the hay moon, after the July hay harvest.

Lucky Four Leaf Clovers were

Celtic charms, presumed to offer magical protection and ward off bad luck. Children in the Middle Ages believed if they carried a four-leaf clover, they would be able to see fairies, and the first literary reference to suggest their good fortune was made in 1620 by Sir John Melton. According to the legend, the leaves of a four-leaf clover rep-

resent hope, faith, love, and a fourth for good luck. The four-leaf clover (Oxalis deppei) is a small plant with four distinct leaves. It's a rare variation of the common three-leaf clover, and because your chances of finding one with four leaves is about 1 in 10,000, they are considered lucky.
