The primary birthstone of June is Pearl, symbolizing faith and purity.

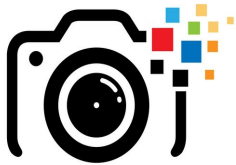
However, Alexandrite and Moonstone share this honour.

## THE MAGNA CARTA 1215

**On 15th June 1215** King John and his barons met on the banks of the River Thames at Runnymede and signed the Magna Carta thus removing total authority from the Monarchy for ever. It is one of the most important documents of all time .

The document underpins our notion of the rule of law – and set a basic set of principles for western liberties. The Magna Carta itself is around 3,350 words long (all in latin) and lays down a basic rule of law and human rights – i.e. that everyone has the right to a free and fair trial.

It decrees: 'No free man is to be arrested, or imprisoned, or diseised [dispossessed], or outlawed, or exiled, or in any way destroyed, nor will we go against him, nor will we send against him, save by the lawful judgement of his peers or by the law of the land.' It adds: 'To no one will we sell, to no one will we deny or delay, right or justice.'

This was laid down by the King John – and was originally designed as a way of maintaining peace between royalists and the rebels. The document was signed in a meadow in Runnymede somewhere near the River Thames. The then Archbishop of Canterbury is believed to have drafted the words. The site is thought to have been chosen as it was between Windsor, which was the royal base, and Staines, the base of the rebels.

## In History—5th June 1783

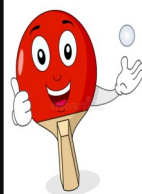
The first sustained flight occurred as a hot-air balloon was launched at Annonay, France, by brothers Joseph and Jacques Montgolfier. Their 33-foot diameter globe aerostatique ascended about 6,000 feet. In September, they repeated the experiment for King Louis XVI, using a sheep, rooster and duck as the balloon's passengers.

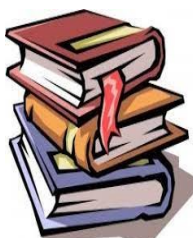

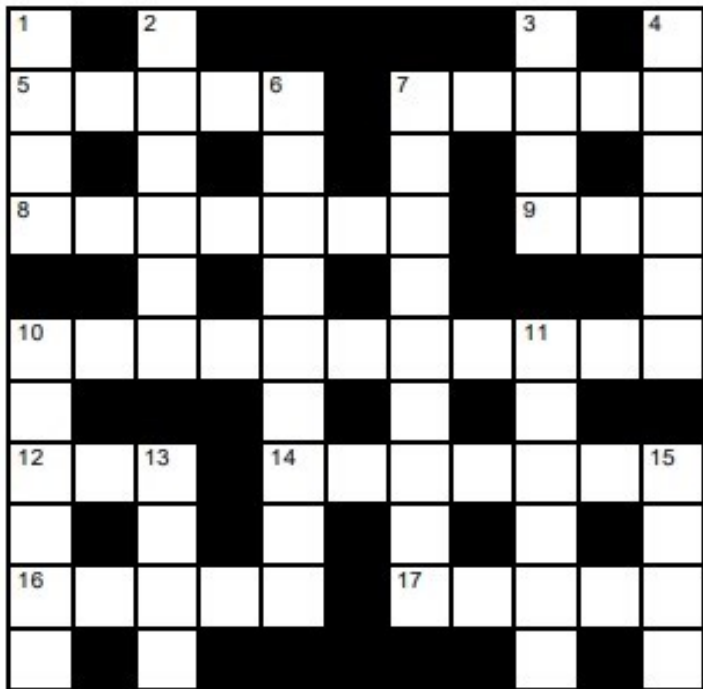

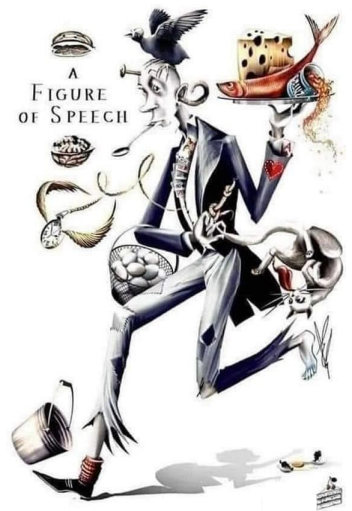

### Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> July—Shibden Hall and Piece Hall, Halifax - £28 per person



Shibden Hall's architecture is a mix of styles reflecting its interesting and varied history. The adjacent 17<sup>th</sup> century aisled barn and workshops house a carriage collection and displays relating to different crafts, including a blacksmiths, coopers, wheelwrights and saddlers.

The Hall is surrounded by the beautifully restored gardens and estate that forms Shibden Park. There are a range of features and attractions, including a cafe and visitor facilities, miniature railway, boating lake, walking trails, play area, orienteering course and woodland in which to roam. Shibden Hall is the focus of the

BBC drama series written by Sally Wainwright, 'Gentleman Jack' exploring the life of Anne Lister (1791 - 1840) and those who lived in the Hall and Estate. The first series aired in 2019 and the second series in 2022.

The Piece Hall in Halifax is a unique Grade I listed building dating back to 1779, originally built to support the trading of 'pieces' of cloth and now reimagined as a new heritage and cultural destination. Home to one of the most striking piazzas in Europe, the stunning Georgian trading hall hosts independent shops, cafés, galleries, bars and heritage spaces. A year-round events programme attracts visitors from far and wide for concerts, street performance, spectacles, film screenings and much more. The Piece Hall is the only surviving intact cloth hall in the UK and an iconic symbol of the important role played by Georgian Halifax at the booming centre of the world's woollen trade.

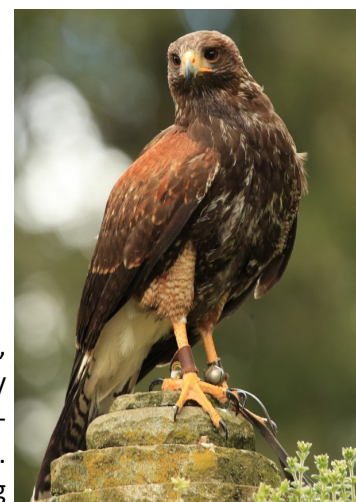


### Friday 15th September—Thorp Perrow Arboretum—£30 per person

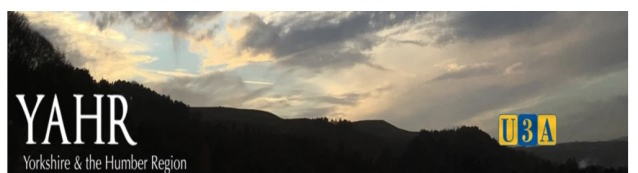
