Dear Members,

As I write there have been no applications to be co-opted onto the committee as Vice Chair. While this does not surprise me I feel that I should make it crystal clear that if no one stands for Chair at our Annual General Meeting in June it would be impossible for our u3a to continue and would put the committee in a very uncomfortable position. Enough said, applications for those members wishing to stand for election to the committee as Officers or ordinary committee members will be sent out in April. Details later in this newsletter.

Planning and preparations are well under way for our 10th Anniversary celebrations in July. More information later in the newsletter.

The renewal subscription for 2022-2023 has been set by the committee at £12 for the full year, £10 for the half year and £8 for three months. This includes a £4 per person membership fee to the Third Age Trust and £1 per member fee for the use of Beacon, software that allows us to maintain a membership database, email members easily, group lists and many other functions. While previously we have been happy to receive cheques in March and not bank them until after the 1st April this year we are trialling payment by bank transfer for those who wish to use this facility and we do not want renewal subscriptions entering the u3a account until after the end of our financial year at the end of March. Renewal notices with details of how to pay will be delivered /posted after the 31st of March. There is also the opportunity to subscribe to Third Age Matters, a magazine for and about the u3a, at £3 if you would like to do so. Payment preferably by bank transfer with the return of the form in all cases and cheques, if this is the preferred method of payment, to the Membership Secretary. Full details will be printed on the renewal notice.

Are there any members who would be willing to act as 'email buddies' for those members who are not on email? It would be helpful for such members to be kept up-to-date between newsletters and group updates. Very occasionally we may need to contact all members at short notice and having members who would be prepared to keep members who are not on email aware of any changes would be of



great assistance. Any member either willing to act as an 'email buddy' or who would benefit from having such a friend please let me know.

I would like to thank our webmasters, Liz and Malcolm Ross who are setting up a Facebook page for members and the public alike to keep them abreast of what is happening in our u3a. It will be a closed Facebook page but Liz and Malcolm would, no doubt, be interested in any comments you may wish to make. Please do let them have any photographs you may have of any activities taking place during the year to keep both the website and Facebook page up to date and interesting; this is our public face towards our local community.

News from Sue Howarth, Existing Groups' Coordinator



The group will be mostly based upon supervised Bridge bidding and play using the examples encountered to discuss related bidding and playing techniques.


