#### Dear Members



#### U3a Cookalong by Sue Cook



Recipe for July - Salmon, strawberry and fennel salad. SERVES 4

#### Inaredients:

200g packet smoked salmon torn in strips 1 fennel bulb halved and sliced in fine strips 50g bag rocket 200g ripe strawberries, hulled and halved

DRESSING:
4tblsp olive oil
2tblsp white wine vinegar
2tsp wholegrain mustard
1 tsp runny honey
crusty brown rolls

Whisk together all dressing ingredients, season and set aside. Put smoked salmon, fennel, rocket and strawberries in a separate bowl. Drizzle dressing over the salad. Gently toss until all ingredients glisten. Finish with some black pepper. Serve with brown rolls.

Can also be served with poached salmon or trout and new potatoes.

#### Gin mojito

6 mint leaves, plus additional for garnish 1 ounce\* lime juice 1 ounce <u>sugar</u> syrup 2 ounces gin 2 to 4 ounces <u>soda water</u> lce, for serving (try <u>clear ice!</u>)

In a cocktail shaker muddle the mint leaves. Add the lime juice, syrup, and gin and fill the cocktail shaker with ice. Shake until cold. lace ice into a glass, and strain in the drink. Top off the glass with <u>soda water</u>. Garnish with additional mint leaves and lime wedges.
