## Droitwich Spa & District u3a Notes on Receipts & Payments for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022

#### 1. Basis of Accounting

This financial statement has been prepared on the basis of monies received and paid in the year.

#### 2. Results for the year

The activities of your u3a recovered well after 2020/21, a year which suffered significantly from the restrictions imposed by Government to combat the Covid pandemic. Notably, in 2021/22 income from Group activities increased seven-fold and we were able to hold our Christmas lunch following the cancellation last year. As a result, there was a large increase in total income despite the fall in membership subscriptions which is explained below. Inevitably, the recovery also to led to a very large rise in expenses.

The reduction in subscriptions this year from £4,564 to £ 2,588 reflects the decrease in the renewal subscription from £10 to £5. The renewal subscription for 2022-23 has been increased to £12 to help avoid a possible further net deficit. The Committee continues to try to balance the financial position of your u3a with acceptable subscription fees.

## 4. Membership Subscription to the Third Age Trust 2022 - £1,586 (2021 - £1,796)

This was payable to the Third Age Trust at the rate of £3.50 per member in the two years up to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021. The £1,586 shown in these accounts is calculated on the number of members at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021. For 2022/23 the Third Age Trust has increased its rate per

member to £4.00 leading to a payment of £1,892 based on our membership, excluding reciprocal members, at 31st March 2022

#### **5. Beacon Subscriptions** 2022 - £464 (2021 – £501)

The subscription for using the Beacon system is a fixed cost of £1.00 per member, including reciprocal members, per annum.

#### **6.** Room/Hall hire 2022 - £3,230 (2021 - £36)

The main reasons for the rise in this cost were, firstly, that the Groups' room/hall hire was £2,100 compared to virtually nil in the previous year, reflecting the uplift in activities and secondly, that the Norbury theatre was used again for talks at a cost of £1,050 following no usage in 2021/22.

#### **7.** Speakers' Fees 2022 - £802 (2021 - £565)

The greater use of the Norbury for talks rather than Zoom led to higher fees in the year as speakers' travel costs rose.

## 8. Events and Groups' expenses 2022 - £3,728 (2021 - £13)

The big increase in these expenses mirrors a similar uplift in income from events and group activities.
