

Andrew Carnegie became the richest man in the world in March 1901 when he sold his steel empire for \$440 million to J P Morgan. Yet little is known of Carnegie's remarkable life story, he was a true visionary figure, a

prolific writer, an arch anti-imperialist in the turbulent politics of late 19th century America and for 30 years a leading advocate of peace through arbitration. The talk examines his life in the context of America in the period 1870 to 1910



- *Frequently wash your hands for 20 seconds and avoid touching your face Sanitise your hands before handling equipment and games. (Sanitiser is available in our cupboard at Jubilee Hall)
- *Ventilate rooms and cars

If you are arranging activity groups, you do need to keep a register of names and contact information. If serving refreshments, please consider the safest way to avoid cross-contamination.

If we each take on the responsibility, to protect ourselves and safeguard our friends, we will be able to enjoy our social lives.
