Speaker for October

Dr Tim Gray MBE tells us of the story of the East Midlands Immediate Care Scheme. In 1980 Dr Gray joined the medical practice in the market town of Oakham in rural Rutland.

Expanding the ethos of the practice



by treating their patients in the community and in the local Cottage Hospital, Dr Gray made himself available on a voluntary basis to the Ambulance Service. By 1984 several of his GP colleagues in the area had joined him and The Rutland Accident Care Scheme (RACS) was launched. This was a charity providing volunteer doctors to work alongside the Ambulance Service treating seriously ill and injured patients both at the scene and en-route to hospital. Since then the scheme has expanded to cover the whole of the East Midlands and renamed as the East Midlands Immediate Care Scheme (EMICS).

An extra talk this month has been arranged at **Ambleside Community Centre** on **Friday 13 October 2023 starting at 2.30pm.** The speaker is Ann Akrill, a retired



Marie Curie nurse who will tell us about the work of the Marie Curie Charity. There is no charge by the charity for this talk, however you can give a personal donation if you wish.






