A BRIEF HISTORY

Old Hampstead Town Hall opened in 1878 and operated as Hampstead Vestry Hall 1878, it was renamed Hampstead Town Hall in 1900, and renamed Old Hampstead Town Hall in 1965 when the council left. The building was abandoned in 1994.

After campaigning from local residents, the building was saved and in 2000 arts charity Wac Arts moved in and is the current custodian of the building. Wac Arts is committing to include heritage as part of its offer and has been looking into this intriguing and surprising history.

Wac Arts has a long association with U3A, and houses the UK's only physical campus and greatly looks forward to working with its London wide members in uncovering more of this unique story.
