### A Snapshot of Shetland

Kathleen Simpson gave a talk on Shetland, illustrated by photos from the ten years she and her family lived there from 2000 to 2010.



Starting in Lerwick, and highlighting the **Up Helly Aa** celebration, which takes place each January – and during which she and her husband Douglas sometimes acted as 'Host and Hostess' at one of the town's halls – Kathleen then moved south to Sumburgh to look at some of the islands' wildlife, with images of some of the birds making Shetland their home, such as puffins and guillemots. She described visits to the islands of Fair Isle, Foula and Out Skerries, and the islanders' way of life there. In their time in Shetland, Kathleen and Douglas also visited the Faroe Islands, travelling on the *Norrona*, and Kathleen spoke about the cruise ships which visited Lerwick Harbour, via the Sooth Mooth.


Finally, she described the 'Gannet Hotel' on the island of Noss, explaining how young gannets leave their nests; and she completed her talk with a memorable Shetland greeting: Here's ta dee and dy folk fae me and my folk and I hoop that when me and my folk meets dee and dy folk at dee and dy folk is aye blyde to see me and my folk as me and my folk is at seein dee and dy folk.

#### **Non-Fiction Book Group**

Jeremy Shearmur lists three of the group's forthcoming books: May: Chris van Tulleken's *Ultra-Processed People* is a striking study by a medical researcher and broadcaster about the harm that certain kinds of 'ultra-processed' food may be doing to us. He explains his case well, and documents his argument with extensive references to the scientific literature, but there is a lot about the book which is controversial.

June 7: David Grann's *The Wager* is a tale of shipwreck, mutiny and murder from the mid-C18.

June 28: Nick Bryant's *When America Stopped Being Great* is an interesting and very readable discussion – by a former BBC correspondent – of America's path from Reagan to Trump.

#### **April Monthly Meeting**
